



QR voice is a great little tool to turn your short text into a QR code with audio. We like this tool because it does two steps on one site. Visit <http://qrvoice.net/> to get started – no login required!

In the box above, you have 100 characters at your disposal. This might be the answer to a vocabulary riddle or math question. It may give quick directions – whatever you can fit in. (Please note that when the “in English” drop-down is changed, the language is not. Only the accent is changed.)

When you are ready to create your QR code, hit the blue button. Here is what you get:



The slider bar will allow you to resize your code. The link is for those participants who might not be smart phone or tablet equipped. You can right-click and copy the image code to paste wherever you need it. The code might show up on a homework assignment, a teacher’s front door, or a learning station.
